

# DCSC 2011 Camp Schedule

## Driving Directions

### From points North

Take US 13 S. to Laurel, DE then turn left onto Rt. 24 E., drive 8 miles then turn right onto Trap Pond Road and make the first right at the DCSC signs. Always follow signs toward Trap Pond State Park.

### From points West

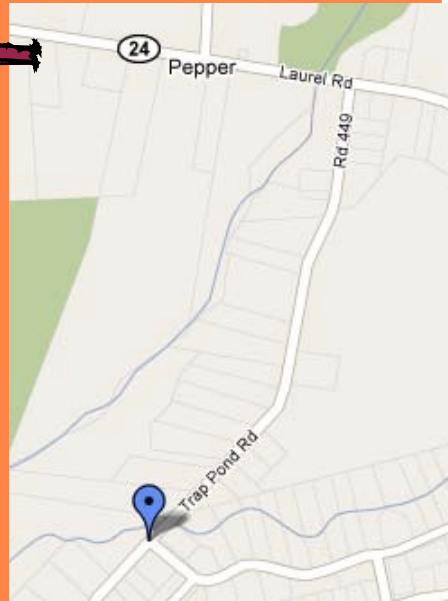
Take US 50 E. to Rt. 13 toward Laurel, DE. Then take Rt. 24 E, drive approximately 8 miles then turn right onto Trap Pond road and make the first right at the DCSC sign. Always follow the signs toward Trap Pond state Park.

### From points East

Take US 113 S. to Rt 24 W. Drive approximately 15 miles then turn left onto Trap Pond road and take the first right at the DCSC sign.

### From points South

Take US 13 N. to Laurel, De. then turn right onto Rt. 24 E. Drive approximately 8 miles then turn right onto Trap Pond Road and make the first right at the DCSC sign.

## Camper/Staff Mail:

Campers eagerly anticipate the daily mail call at the evening meal. Traditionally, anyone receiving 3 letters/postcards must sing a song or tell a joke to receive their mail! ## Telephone Usage:

If your child is prone to homesickness, it is usually best just to write them rather than visit or call. Encourage them before they come to have a good time and remind them that you will pick them up at the end of the week. The phone is not for camper use. Only in an emergency determined by the camp Dean will campers be allowed to use the phone. The DCSC phone number is 302-875-3663.

## Visitors:

All visitors must check in with the Dean upon arrival in order to receive permission to visit. Visitors must abide by all camp rules and stay no later than 10:00PM. Visitor meals are \$3.00 per person per meal.

## Insurance:

Primary coverage is the responsibility of the camper's family insurance policy. All doctor and hospital forms should be completed using the patient's name, home address, and personal insurance information. The camp policy will pay costs not covered by the primary policy to the limits of the camp policy. Parents/guardians must list their insurance company(ies) and policy number(s) on the registration form.

# Details

## Registration:

Completed health/registration form should be sent to the registrar, Rich Paris at 143 Turner Drive, Dover, DE., 19904. You must register for your own age group, as indicated by the grade entering in September of 2010. To guarantee your reservation, please register early!

## What To Bring:

Bible, paper, pencil, bedding, pillow, rainwear, flashlight, stationary and stamps, portable fan, musical instrument, camera, prescription medicine, comfortable footwear, missions-canteen money, (\$10 - \$20), sweater or light jacket, shower/flip-flops, bathrobe. All prescription medications must be in their original pharmacy issued containers with dosage labeling.

## What Not To Bring:

Radio, stereo, iPod or other electronic music device, electronic games, cell phones, illegal drugs, alcohol, knives, firearms, playing cards, magazines, comic books, food/candy, beverages. All of the above items are confiscatable and will become discretionary property of the Dean. At no time will food or drink be allowed in the dorms.

## Arrival and Departure:

Check-in time is 3:00PM on Sunday. No one will be allowed entrance into the dorm without first checking in. Mandatory head checks for lice will be conducted by the camp nurse or qualified designee, for health reasons, both on campers and staff upon arrival. Any camper with head lice will be isolated and a full refund of tuition will be made, as per determination of the Dean and nurse.

# Camp Rules

1. Christ-like conduct and attitudes are expected of everyone attending Delmarva Christian Service Camp. The dean may dismiss anyone who refuses to obey camp regulations.
2. Possession of alcohol, illegal drugs, tobacco, firearms or knives will result in immediate dismissal and possible police contact.
3. Campers cars driven to DSCS must be parked and locked with the keys given to the Dean upon arrival.
4. No one is permitted to leave the camp without permission of the Dean.
5. Everyone is to adhere to the camp schedule, unless excused by the Dean.
6. All medicines must be given to the camp nurse upon arrival. All prescription medications must be in their original pharmacy issued container, specifying dosages. All illnesses or injuries must be reported at once to the camp nurse or the Dean.
7. Per Delaware State Health department regulations, all campers must have had a physical within the last 12 months prior to their week of camp (See registration form).
8. Body piercing jewelry is not permitted on camp property except women's earrings in women's ears.
9. All jewelry including earrings must be removed before entering into the pool.

## Goals

The primary goal of the camp is to provide an unusual setting, apart from the daily routines and often unchristian surroundings of daily living. In this setting the word of God is taught and principles of christian living are emphasized on a continuing basis.

## Dress Code:

Any fashion (clothing, accessory, or hairstyle ) that distracts from the spiritual atmosphere or presents a safety risk will not be permitted. This includes but is not limited to plunging necklines, bare midriffs, short shorts, brief swim wear, short dresses, or immodest tight apparel.

The standard for acceptable length of shorts and dresses will be the campers own fingertips when the arms are fully extended downward. Shorts should have at least a 4 inch inseam. The dean will determine (on a case by case basis) the appropriateness of the clothing.

Shirts designed as underclothing may not be worn outwardly in public. See through clothing, such as sheer blouses may not be worn. Spaghetti-strap tops are not permitted. All pants should be worn at the waist (no sagging) and undergarments should not be visible.

Clothing and other accessories with advertising of such things as alcoholic beverages, drugs, sexual implications or with messages with poor taste such as secular concerts or profanity are a violation. Footwear must be worn and secure at all times (accidents caused by or resulting from not wearing proper footwear or unsafe footwear might not be covered by insurance.)

Females are required to wear one piece bathing suits while in the pool area. No bikinis are allowed. Both the dean and the life guard shall have authority to require that dark colored shirt be worn over any immodest swim wear. Males with immodest swim wear will be required to put on an acceptable pair of shorts.

Except while swimming, males must wear a shirt in public at all times.

Note: DCSC and it's staff shall not be held responsible for any articles lost, stolen or left at camp. Lost and found items are held until the end of the summer and then are donated to the needy.
